We specialise in services for young people, homeless families and individuals, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities and people with mental health needs.

Accommodation



Accommodation type

Seven self-contained, one-bedroom flats and six two-bedroom houses. All accommodation is unfurnished.



Location

A residential area of Birkenhead, within walking distance of shops, leisure facilities and public transport links.



Communal areas

There is a communal lounge, kitchen and bathroom.



Technology

We can provide assistive technology for additional safety and reassurance, which can be purchased at additional cost.



Safety and security

Staff office on-site, CCTV and a secure gate and door access system help to ensure residents' safety and security.

All apartments are let on an assured shorthold tenancy agreement.

Support

Everyone is supported to achieve greater independence. Our highly-trained staff draw up a personalised support plan with residents to help them establish and achieve their goals.

Staff are on-site various hours from Monday to Friday, to provide low-level housing management support. There is also an out-of-hours telephone service, should residents require any further support.

Residents can also purchase additional telecare technology to further promote their independence.

- Cooking, cleaning and shopping
- Building positive relationships
- Developing hobbies and interests
- Dealing with correspondence
